Dear Dr. Carothers:

This letter is in regard to your petition dated May 26, 2015, received by our office via electronic mail on the same date, requesting that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) delist the federally endangered Navasota ladies'-tresses (*Spiranthes parksii*) pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended.

On June 16, 2015, we sent you a letter stating that we would not able to address your petition to delist the federally endangered Navasota ladies'-tresses at that time because of higher workload priorities for Fiscal Year 2015. Since that time, we have completed many of our workload priorities and are currently working on a 90-day finding that will address your petition. Currently, we are analyzing the information in the petition and in our files to make a finding as to whether the petition presents substantial scientific or commercial information indicating that the petitioned action may be warranted. We plan on including this 90-day finding in the quarterly batched notice that the Service will submit to the *Federal Register* for publication in February 2016.
